### ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT - ERIK BALDWIN, AP 412

The Alpha Rho Alumni Chapter is proud to share the next version of our Alumni Spotlight. Brother Erik Baldwin, AP 412 serves as Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of the Alpha Rho Alumni Board of Directors and he took some time to provide us some insight into his and his family's life.

## Tell us a little bit about yourself (career, family, hobbies and interests)

I am a West Virginia native. I was born and raised in Sissonville, WV. I currently live in the Pittsburgh area in Mars, PA with my wife, Andrea, and two kids, Isabella and Jack. I graduated from WVU in 2001 with a degree in Medical Technology from the School of Medicine. I also have an MBA in Healthcare Management from Regis University and a Master's degree in Military Operational Arts and Sciences from the USAF Air University. I was initiated in the Spring of 1996.
